Another specialty program Legacy offers is Apex, a state funded program dedicated to providing school based mental health services to youth and their families. Staff work closely with school staff to identify the needs of students and conduct therapy sessions within the student's school. Apex is currently offered in all Valdosta City Schools, Echols County Schools, Cook County Schools, six Lowndes County Schools, and Tift High School.

Previously, Legacy BHS had an opportunity to conduct the Strengthening Families Program which was a great success. The families, despite being reluctant to participate at first, grew as a cohort, developed helpful skills, and gained insight on how to repair broken bonds within the family. Staff witnessed families utilizing new communication skills, displaying love and support for one another, and applying appropriate limit setters, consequences, and social praise to encourage wanted behaviors. This specific program in one of our success stories, how well panned program can facilitate engagement, healing, and hope. Specifically, this program was designed to reduce/eliminate future legal issues, help families gain a sense of togetherness, and create lasting change, which reflect our core mission, vision, and values.
