HISTORY, FACTS AND ISSUES: The Valdosta Lowndes County Development Authority (VLDA) will be requesting an EIP Grant to extend Arglass Road. The grant request will come at a later date as a request to Lowndes County to be the applicant. Lowndes County has to procure an engineer as part of preparation for the grant application to complete preliminary work. The engineer will be paid by the VLDA.

Lowndes County solicited a request for qualifications from Professional Engineers. Staff received 3 proposals from qualifying engineers. A scoresheet was developed, and all three (3) firms were given a total score based on the scoring criteria. The most one firm could score is 72. The firms scored as follows:

Lovell Engineering Associates, PC (3998 Inner Perimeter Road, Valdosta GA) received a score of # 67 Carter and Slope Consulting Engineers (6310 Peake Rd, Macon GA) received a score of # 64 AE Engineering, INC (219 N Newnan St, 4th Floor, Jacksonville FL) received a score of # 58

Based on the scoring criteria, staff recommends Lovell Engineering Associates, PC to be approved as the Professional Engineer.

COUNTY ACTION REQUESTED ON: Approval of Hazard Mitigation Planning Grant Application

HISTORY, FACTS AND ISSUES: The Lowndes County Hazard Mitigation Plan is currently approved through January 2027. In order to gain funding to assist with the planning and update process, the Georgia Emergency Management Agency has advised Lowndes County to submit an application for funding through the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) which was recently made available to eligible counties in Georgia. Normally, under the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grant program, funding is provided on a cost share basis with the federal share making up 75 percent of the funding and Lowndes County providing the remaining 25 percent. By applying now under the HMGP, we will be able to leverage not only the Federal funding, but also reduce the local cost share due to the State of Georgia's contributions under this particular grant program. As a result, even though the contractual costs are estimated to be higher during the next revision, the local cost share is actually lower. Because the time staff spends in attending planning meetings, gathering information, and otherwise participating in plan development is an allowable expense, Lowndes County's cost share can be met by documenting this time and submitting it as part of the reimbursement process of the grant. This will allow Lowndes County to meet the terms of the grant guidance without an actual cash allocation being required. Once Lowndes County receives notice of funding approval, they can begin the process of selecting a qualified consultant and begin the plan update process to ensure we maintain our compliance status and eligibility for federal disaster related funding in the future.

Section 6.01 Term. The term of this agreement is 1 year beginning January 1, 2024 and ending December 31, 2024. This agreement may be renewed by the Public Defender Office by providing written notice to each of the county representatives designated in Section 6.05 within 30 days prior to the expiration of the agreement in accordance with Section 6.06. This agreement may also be renewed when the annual budget has been agreed to by all parties. Notice of the renewal will be sent by the Public Defender to the representatives of the parties identified in Section 6.05.

In addition, the parties to this agreement acknowledge and consent to the continued rollover of the county's surplus funds, if any, from the previous calendar year budgets to be retained on behalf of the Public Defender Program for FY 2024-2025.

COUNTY ACTION REQUESTED ON: Approval of SG's FY24 VOCA Grant Award

HISTORY, FACTS AND ISSUES: The Solicitor-General's Office has been a recipient of the Federal Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funds since 2014. This grant is vital in sustaining the Victim Services Program as it funds two of the SG's Victim Advocates. Over the last couple of years, the Federal Crime Victims Fund that supports the VOCA grant has declined significantly and the deposits that are currently going into the fund are not expected to sustain awards to states at their current levels. The Prosecuting Attorney's Council (PAC) has informed the Solicitor-General's Office that the FY24 VOCA Award will be in the amount of \$75,020.00, which results in a significant cut in federal funds when compared to previous years. The FY23 VOCA Award was funded at \$98,691.00. This cut in federal funding represents a decrease in the amount of \$23,671.00. The previous cash match required by the County for the VOCA Grant was \$6,000.00. However, due to cuts in funding and in order for the Victim Advocates to receive their raises that have already been accounted for in the County's 2023-2024 FY Budget, the county would be required to provide a cash match of \$33,232.00. The performance period for this grant runs from October 1, 2023-September 30, 2024. The Solicitor General's office requests the board's approval of the FY24 VOCA Grant Award and permission for the Chairman to sign all necessary documents to be included in the award packet.

Compared to the FY23 VOCA Award, for the FY24 VOCA Grant: We will need an additional \$27,232 from the county in Cash Match Funds for a Total Cash Match of \$33,232.

We received a cut of \$23,671 in Federal Funds for the FY24 (October 01, 2023-September 30, 2024).

The county approved a Cash Match of \$9,561 for VOCA in the County's 2024 FY Budget. This includes the \$6,000 needed for insurance premiums and \$3,561 for a raise for the two grant funded Victim Advocates. They have not received a raise in 3 years.

If we do not receive the additional cash match from the county, we will lose our Family Violence Specialist and Volunteer Coordinator (Ashley Anderson).

SECTION C CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT FOR LOWNDES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

THIS AGREEMENT made this _____ day of _____, in the year 20 _____ and between Lowndes County Board of Commissioners, hereinafter called the OWNER, and Chuck Smith and Son Construction, Inc., hereinafter called the CONTRACTOR, WITNESSETH, that the parties hereto do mutually agree as follows:

1. The CONTRACTOR shall furnish all permits, labor, materials, tools and equipment to perform all the work shown on the Contract Documents, which include: Drawing CS-1, C-0, C-1, C-2, C-3, S-0, S-1, S-2, S-3, S-4, A-1, A-2, A-3, M-1 and addendum No. 1 Dated 11/28/23 and the Specifications entitled *Francis Lake Warehouse Modifications for Lowndes County Board of Commissioners.*

Prepared by: Crews Engineering, Inc., who is referred to in the Contract Documents as the Engineer. It is the intent of the parties and it is hereby agreed that the CONTRACTOR shall perform all work covered by this contract and the Contract Documents.

2. The performance of this contract shall be commenced ten (10) days after notice to proceed is issued by the OWNER and shall be fully completed within 120 days of contract date, time being of the essence.

3. The OWNER shall pay the CONTRACTOR the sum of \$395,980.00 subject to adjustment by additive or deductive Change Orders. If required, due to conflict with existing buried utilities, add \$1,000 for installation of force main and lift station (owner to supply package e-one lift station). Additionally, if the owner accepts addendum No. 1 in lieu of repairing/ patching existing failing vinyl back roof insulation the contractor shall remove the existing failing insulation and apply spray foam roof insulation at roof for an additional \$1,000.00.

4. The OWNER shall make partial payment to the CONTRACTOR as follows:

On or about the fifteenth (15th) day of each month, ninety (90) per cent of the value of the labor and materials incorporated into the work and ninety (90) per cent of the value of the materials suitably stored at the site of the work, less the sum of all previous payment, upon receipt of an acceptable partial payment request approved by the Engineer. (In accordance with Section 13-10-2 of Georgia Code Annotated.)

5. Final payment under this contract will be due to the CONTRACTOR thirty (30) days after the issuance of the final certificate by the Engineer. The CONTRACTOR agrees that before applying for final payment, he will furnish to the OWNER the Statutory Affidavit, Non-Influence Affidavit, and the warranties and guaranties called for in the specifications.

6. By executing this contract, Contractor certifies that he shall provide a drug-free workplace for his employees and the employees of his subcontractors in accordance with the laws of the State of Georgia. The Contract Documents which form the basis of this contract shall be the plans and specifications as enumerated in project documents, together with the other documents so listed and enumerated, if any, and it is expressly understood that the general conditions contained in the specifications listed below are specifically made a part of this contract.

7. The OWNER and the CONTRACTOR hereby agree to the full performance of the conditions and stipulations contained herein.
